



Being Ellen is Finally Published!

Three weeks ago, *Being Ellen: A Second Chance at Life* dropped onto Amazon, making the book available to the world at large. It was a long time in coming—I started on it a year after my first book, *Getting to Ellen: A Memoir about Love, Honesty and Gender Change*, was published in 2013.

Frankly, for years, writing *Being Ellen* was sporadic. I'd go a few months really giving it a try and then due to various demands—speaking, caring for others, the general hubbub of life—my writing would drop off. In 2019, I really tried for a big restart while sitting on a friend's lovely deck overlooking Lake Superior, but that stint faltered, too.

Then, in July 2023, I decided it was now or never. I repositioned a desk in my sunroom so that it faced a set of sliders and sat down and began writing. I wrote for two to four hours every day from then on until I had something that really read like a book. I then gave the draft book to some beta readers (friends who believe in me and my work) who provided critical feedback. After some revisions, the book was ready for editors; by the time *Being Ellen* reached Amazon, it had gone through four paid sets of professional eyes.

In a perfect world, the book would get some notice, some real traction. It contains important messages about living true to oneself, the important role of one's chosen family, and about reaching out to those who fear "other." But given the political realities of America right now, it's possible that a book written by a very public transgender woman is literary kryptonite. We shall see.

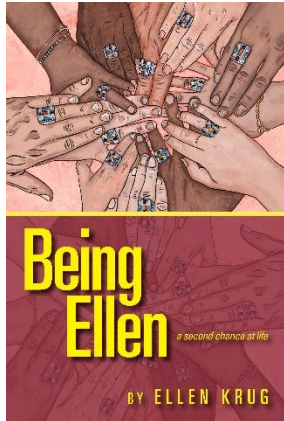

Victoria MN: Author, columnist, and national speaker on human inclusivity, Ellen (Ellie) Krug has published her long-awaited second book, *Being Ellen: A Second Chance at Life* (Stepladder Press), which details Ellie's fifteen-year "womanhood journey" following her gender transition in 2009.



The book is about Ellie's "second-chance life" of finally living as a woman, where she finds acceptance by family, friends, and younger female mentees. However, not all is rosy—Ellie faces rejection too, including by her oldest daughter Emily, and she encounters repeated marginalization when attempting to date men.

The arc of *Being Ellen* is about finding one's "chosen family" and how Thap, her best friend from eighth grade, never wavers in his support. That support is reciprocal—Ellie is there for Thap and his wife Bebo when they experience the death of an adult child. She also becomes an "aunt" to Nisty, Thap's daughter and a budding artist.

Additionally, *Being Ellen* chronicles Ellie's idealistic attempt—inspired by the words of Dr. King and Bobby Kennedy—to spread compassion and kindness across the world. It's an improbable story of a transgender woman with a man's voice who somehow touches the hearts of even the most hardened. Indeed, the book offers hope at this desperate time in which America finds itself, and the book will leave the reader inspired to offer others greater compassion and kindness as they go forward in their own lives!

Being Ellen follows Ellie's initial book, *Getting to Ellen: A Memoir about Love, Honesty and Gender Change* (Stepladder Press). Published in 2013, *Getting to Ellen* documents Ellie's struggle to come out as her true self at age fifty-two. That book has almost a five-star rating on Amazon and has received incredibly favorable reviews from everyday readers.

Ellen (Ellie) Krug transitioned genders in 2009 when she was a civil trial attorney in Cedar Rapids with 100+ trials to her credit. She later became one of the few attorneys nationally to try jury cases in separate genders. With her company, Human Inspiration Works, LLC, Ellie has presented on diversity and inclusion to hundreds of organizations on more than one thousand occasions. A hopeless idealist, Ellie has presented her inclusivity workshop, Gray Area Thinking®, across North America with the goal of making the world more compassionate and kinder for all humans.

Ellie is the recipient of the 2023 Stonewall Award from the American Bar Association, and a 2019 OutFront Minnesota Legacy Award. *Advocate Magazine* named Ellie as one of “25 Legal Advocates Fighting for Trans Rights.” She is also a columnist for *Minnesota Women's Press* and a past decade-long columnist for *Lavender Magazine*. She also hosts a weekly radio/podcast show, “The Illegal Trans Woman,” on AM950 KTNF in the Twin Cities. Her e-newsletter, *The Ripple*, reaches 9000+ readers. In November 2022, Ellie was elected to her local school board in a rural-urban county outside the Twin Cities, making her one of a handful of transgender school board members in the country.
